Welcome to the latest edition of the Heybridge Basin Parish Council Newsletter.

PRECEPT

The Parish Council's Precept is the portion of your Council Tax that is used to fund local services, projects and day-to-day running costs within Heybridge Basin. For the financial year **2025/26**, the Council has set its Precept at **£29,000**, which represents a **4.92% reduction** compared to last year's figure of £30,500. This reflects the Council's continued focus on careful budgeting while maintaining the services and improvements that benefit the community.

DAISY MEADOW GARDENER

We are pleased to confirm that a gardener has now been successfully appointed within Daisy Meadow Car Park. The contract will run from 1st December 2025 to 31st March 2026, with the option to extend or renew, subject to performance and the Council's future requirements. This appointment will help ensure the car park remains tidy, well-presented and welcoming for residents and visitors

VILLAGE SIGN

The Parish Council would like to thank residents for their patience while work was carried out on the village sign. The previous sign was found to be in a dangerous condition and, for safety reasons, had to be removed. The sign and surrounding flowerbed have now been replaced and are already making a positive difference to the entrance to the village. Thank you to everyone involved in helping to deliver this improvement for the community.

Please ensure images include the date and time they were taken, as this allows patterns and peak pressures to be properly demonstrated. All evidence received will be used to support the Council's ongoing discussions with SEPP.

DOG FOULING – HOW YOU CAN HELP

Dog fouling continues to be reported in parts of the village. While Maldon District Council does not have a dedicated Dog Warden, residents can help by reporting incidents online. Reports made via the Maldon District Council website allow the District Council to gather information and identify problem areas, which may then enable them to carry out targeted patrols in the future. The more reports that are received, the better the chance of enforcement action being taken, so residents are encouraged to log any dog fouling they encounter.
