# DAISY MEADOW CAR PARK (DMCP)

The Parish Council are pleased to announce the completion of the re-surfacing of the access road and would like to thank residents for their patience whilst this work was underway and the increased on-street parking.

The next phase of the car park project is to plant areas within the car park with plants that will attract a variety of wildlife, insects and invertebrates as well as improving the visual impact of the car park.

Plans are being put in place to make the old toilet block into a garden area with native trees, shrubs, plants, and bulbs. The raised bed at the far end will form a natural corridor for plants, trees, and wildlife.

Looking at the area between the bottom of the car park and the canal, plans could be to sympathetically trim back the damaged branches of the existing trees and remove rubbish, as well as possibly leaving an area of cut logs/branches for invertebrates.
